In answer to your letter in regards to the Alger Family is the enclosed information. In my work as Town Historian letters such as yours are passed on to me.

Mr. Libbey and I have a map of the cemeteries we have found and I have copied here in Scarborough, forty eight to-date. The earliest stone in the cemetery at Dunstan is 1782 Capt. John Fabyan. Anyone buried before this we have no record of. In both of our Town cemeteries are sunken places where we have been told some of our early settlers were buried.

I understood from your letter that you had my book, Scarborough Becomes A Town. On the map in the book you perhaps found where the Algers settled at Dunstan.

Taken from our early Town Records:

1681 - Andrew Alger, 40 acres marsh, 20 acres upland. Just below And lived John Palmer (husband of Andrew's daughter Elizabeth). This Palmer had 20 acres upland and six acres marsh. In the York County Deeds is the Deed of land to Andrew and Arthur Alger from Jane the Indian, and her mother Naguasqua the wife of Wickwarrawaske and her brother.
