SOUTHGATE HOUSE

Dunstan, Maine

Approximate Date Built 1805

The Southgate House was built by Dr. Robert Southgate who was born in Leicester, Massachusetts and came to Dunstan in 1771.

He built his first home on what was called the Landing Road. The house was built of brick which was moulded and baked on the site. Before that time, travel was done most often by water as it was nearly 1800 before stage coaches became common and horseback travel was rather infrequent. When travel by coach became common, Dr. Southgate built the house on what was then the route of the new turnpike. The turnpike passed by the house, over the meadow and wound up around Scottow's Hill and followed into Portland through Stroudwater. (The only bridge at that time over the Fore River was at Stroudwater.) The turnpike was built of gravel hauled by ox cart from a gravel pit on Scottow's Hill. It was a toll road and the gatekeeper and toll house were located nearly in front of the new Southgate House.

Dr. Southgate was a graduate of Harvard College where he studied medicine. He was a physician, was Judge of Court of Common Sessions, and also is said to have been an excellent well builder. It is said that there were, a few years ago, several good wells in Dunstan, the stone work of which was laid by Dr. Southgate. The Southgates had a family of twelve children. The entire family was well educated and respected. Dr. Southgate married Mary, daughter of Richard King of Scarborough and probably a sister to Maine's first governor, William King.

Eliza, daughter of Dr. Southgate, was educated at a girl's school in Medford, Massachusetts. She, at one time, wrote a book "A Girl's Life Eighty Years Ago."

It was through Dr. Southgate's initiative that the new turnpike was built. The previous road was a winding affair and much longer than the new road. It is said that foot travelers and travelers on horseback were often evasive about paying toll on the new road and that there was a half circular path, well worn, around the turnpike gate which was made by these "toll evaders."

Dr. Southgate came to the District of Maine with only his horse and saddle bags, but it is said he became quite wealthy. A fine house like the one he built on the turnpike usually meant in those days that a person was successful. Dr. Southgate lived to be 92 years old and died in 1833. The house was afterward occupied by his son Judge Horatio Southgate, Register of Probate Court. The house was later owned by Col. Fred Dow.

Bishop Southgate, noted missionary, and Harriet Beecher Stowe, author of "Uncle Tom's Cabin" were descendants of the Southgates.
