





THE FOUR CORNERS

Three hundred years ago Scarborough became a town! Today the scenic marshlands, the winding rivers, the fragrant pines, and irregular coastline remain unchanged, but how the town has grown and changed! The Four Corners is not large enough to record this growth. Even the history of our high school, which dates back to the 1800's, is beyond our scope; however, for the reader's enjoyment we have tried to indicate some contrasts between the one-room-one-teacher school in which we had our beginnings, and our present school, with its half-million dollar building, its enrollment of over three hundred students, and its excellent faculty of fourteen teachers. 
Another woman, whose work enriched our lives is Sara Steele, our first music supervisor, loved by all who learned to appreciate music in her classes. The melody still lingers on.


# Swimming and Rifle
